Reign over us, dearest Mother, that we may be thine in prosperity and in adversity; in joy and in sorrow; in health and in sickness; in life and in death. O most compassionate heart of Mary, Queen of Virgins, watch over our minds and our hearts and preserve them from the deluge of impurity which Thou didst lament so sorrowfully at Fatima. We want to be pure like thee. We want to atone for the many sins committed against Jesus and thee. We want to call down upon our country and the whole world the peace of God in justice and charity.

Therefore, we now promise to imitate thy virtues by the practice of a Christian life without regard to human respect. We resolve to receive Holy Communion on the first Saturday of every month and to offer thee five decades of the rosary each day together with our sacrifices in a spirit of reparation and penance. Amen

Act of Reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary

Most Holy Virgin, and our beloved Mother, we listen with grief to the complaints of thy Immaculate Heart, surrounded with the thorns which ungrateful men place therein at every moment by their blasphemies and ingratitude. Moved by the ardent desire of loving thee as our Mother and of promoting true devotion to Thy Immaculate Heart, we prostrate ourselves at thy feet to prove the sorrow we feel for the grief that men cause thee and to atone by means of our prayers and sacrifices for the offenses with which men return thy tender love. Obtain for them and for us the pardon of so many sins. A word from thee will obtain grace and forgiveness for us all. Hasten, O Lady, the conversion of sinners, that they may love Jesus and cease to offend God, already so much offended, and thus avoid eternal punishment. Turn, thine eyes of mercy toward us so that hence forth we may love God with all our hearts while on earth and enjoy Him forever in heaven. Amen.

Magnificat

The Five Joyful Mysteries

1. The Annunciation - The grace of Humility.

Meditation:

In union with Our Lady, consider the astounding humiliations suffered in atonement for your pride by Him Who is the brightness of eternal light, the unspotted mirror of God's majesty and the image of His goodness.

Rejoice with Mary because of her high dignity, and think of her exceedingly deep humility, now that she has become the Mother of God.

How little you resemble her in your vanity and wishes for the esteem of the world! Put down your pride and make serious efforts to acquire the virtue of humility, which is so necessary and without which no other can exist in a soul.

We offer Thee, O Lord Jesus, this first decade in honor of Thy Incarnation in Mary's womb, and we ask of Thee, through this Mystery and through her intercession, a profound humility. Amen.

Our Father..., Hail Mary... (ten times), Glory be to the Father... May the grace of the Mystery of the Annunciation come down into our souls.

2. The Visitation - The grace of Charity towards Our Neighbor

Meditation:

Follow Our Lady on the way to St. Elizabeth's house, and while you meditate on the meaning of this mystery, adore Jesus in Mary's womb. Through her, He now begins to cast the fire of His love into the hearts of men. How great is His love for you even now! How great a desire your Divine Saviour already has to see the day on which he will sacrifice Himself on Calvary for your salvation!

How do you practice charity? Do you not often offend against it? See, then in what way Our Lady wishes you to correct yourself in regard to this virtue and beseech her to inflame your heart with true charity for your neighbor.

We offer Thee, O Lord Jesus, this second decade in honor of the Visitation of Thy

holy Mother to her cousin St. Elizabeth and the sanctification of St. John the Baptist, and we ask of Thee, through this Mystery and through the intercession of Thy Holy Mother, charity towards our neighbor. Amen.

Our Father..., Hail Mary... (ten times), Glory be to the Father... May the grace of the Mystery of the Visitation come down into our souls.

3. The Nativity - The grace of Contempt of Riches and Love of Poverty

Meditation:

What poverty in the stable of Bethlehem! A handful of straw; swaddling clothes, which give the Child but little protection against the cold; poor shepherds to form the entire retinue of the King.

Admire this state of destitution which marks but the beginning of all that Jesus is to suffer till He is entirely stripped on Calvary. Become more and more detached from earthly things and with a firm confidence ask of Mary to obtain for you the grace of being poor in spirit.

We offer Thee, O Lord Jesus, this third decade in honor of Thy Nativity in the stable of Bethlehem, and we ask of Thee, through this Mystery and through the intercession of Thy holy Mother, detachment from the things of the world, contempt of riches and love of poverty. Amen.

Our Father..., Hail Mary... (ten times), Glory be to the Father... May the grace of the Mystery of the Nativity come down into our souls.

4. The Presentation in the Temple - The grace of Purity of Body and Soul

Meditation:

In union with Mary adore Jesus in the arms of holy Simeon. From what you see in this mystery, learn that Jesus gives Himself in preference to a soul that is pure and detached from the world. Eternal Wisdom is a vapor of the power of God and a certain pure emanation of the glory of the almighty God, and therefore no defiled thing cometh into her.

Cultivate then in your heart a great love for purity, by which you are made like the angels and intimately united with God. But be ever convinced that you can acquire this virtue only by keeping a constant watch over your bodily senses and by being truly devoted to Mary.

We offer Thee, O Lord Jesus, this fourth decade in honor of Thy Presentation in the Temple and the Purification of Mary, and we ask of Thee, through this Mystery and through the intercession of Thy holy Mother, purity of body and soul. Amen.

Our Father..., Hail Mary... (ten times), Glory be to the Father... May the grace of the Mystery of the Presentation in the Temple come down into our souls. Amen.

5. **The Finding of Our Lord in the Temple** - The grace of True Wisdom **Meditation:**

While you console with Our Lady in her sorrow, when she seeks the Divine Child for three days, look into your own heart, and in Mary's presence see what your desires are for possessing Jesus in your soul. Do you shed tears, or at least do you feel sad on realizing that you are still far from Him.? Mary is the spiritual magnet that will attract Jesus into your soul. Take her as your guide in the ways of the interior life, and she will help you find Jesus in the temple of your heart wherein He dwells. She will teach you to treasure in your memory all the good and beautiful things His love urged Him to do for you.

We offer Thee, O Lord Jesus, this fifth decade in honor of Mary's finding Thee in the Temple, and we ask of Thee, through this Mystery and through her intercession, the gift of true wisdom. Amen.

Our Father..., Hail Mary... (ten times), Glory be to the Father... May the grace of the Mystery of the finding of Our Lord in the Temple come down into our souls. Amen.

The Five Sorrowful Mysteries

1. **The Agony in the Garden** - The grace of Contrition for sins. **Meditation:**

Listen to the tender complaints of Jesus in the Garden of Olives: "My soul is sorrowful even unto death. My Father, if it be possible, let this chalice pass from Me". Compassionate your sorrowful Mother while you offer this decade to her. She has so often shed tears of sorrow for your offences and for those of all sinners. Ask her to touch your heart with grace of sincere contrition for until now you have grieved but little for your sins. Pray also for the conversion of some great sinner, but especially ask her to obtain the grace of true contrition for all those who depart this life today.

We offer Thee, O Lord Jesus, this sixth decade in honor of Thy Agony in the Garden of Olives, and we ask of Thee, through this Mystery and through the intercession of Thy holy Mother, contrition for our sins. Amen.

Our Father..., Hail Mary... (ten times), Glory be to the Father... May the grace of the Mystery of the Agony in the Garden come down into our souls. Amen.

2. The Scourging - The grace of Mortification of our senses.

Meditation:

With what reproaches and infamies has your dear Savior been overwhelmed for love of you, from the moment of His agony till that of His scourging! The mere thought of them ought to instill in your heart the deepest feelings of horror for the slightest sins of sensuality, for which your innocent Jesus has suffered so painfully. Sympathize with Our Lady in the sorrows which this harrowing scene of the scourging causes to her heart and beg of her the grace to mortify your senses. Many sinners place their soul in danger of damnation for the sake of sensual pleasure! Pray for their conversion.

We offer Thee, O Lord Jesus, this seventh decade in honor of Thy bloody Scourging, and we ask of Thee, through this Mystery and through the intercession of Thy holy Mother, the grace of mortifying our senses. Amen.

Our Father..., Hail Mary... (ten times), Glory be to the Father... May the grace of the Mystery of the Scourging come down into our souls.

3. The Crowning with Thorns - The grace of Contempt of the World.

Meditation:

Consider the pitiful state to which your pride has reduced your sweet Saviour, the King of Kings, the Lord of Lords. Adore Him now that He is crowned with thorns, covered with tattered cloak of purple, made king by a lawless body of soldiers who load Him down with insults and all sorts of ill-treatment.

Unite with Mary and offer your acts of adoration, of compassion and of love in atonement for so many outrages. Beseech her to offer worthy thanks to Jesus on your behalf, and ask for the grace to know yourself better, in order to loathe and despise yourself.

We offer Thee, O Lord Jesus, this eighth decade in honor of Thy being crowned with thorns, and we ask of Thee, through this Mystery and through the intercession of Thy holy Mother, contempt of the world, Amen.

Our Father..., Hail Mary... (ten times), Glory be to the Father... May the grace of the Mystery of the Crowning with Thorns come down into our souls. Amen.

4. The Carrying of the Cross - The grace of Patience in bearing our crosses.

Meditation:

See how lovingly Jesus embraces His cross and takes it upon His shoulders! He beholds in it the sign of your redemption, the powerful weapon that will crush your enemies. Express your gratitude to Jesus and at the same time offer your sympathy to Mary, whose heart is so cruelly rent when she meets her Divine Son. Admire her zeal in sharing the sufferings and humiliations of Jesus on Calvary.

How do you practice resignation to the will of God in the trials of life? How do you love your crosses? Repent of the many murmurings of which you are guilty and beseech Our Lady to make you see that it is profitable to your soul to be warned of your shortcomings and to undergo in this world the punishment of your sins and of your pride. We offer Thee, O Lord Jesus, this ninth decade in honor of Thy carrying of the Cross, and we ask of Thee, through this Mystery and through the intercession of Thy holy Mother, patience in bearing our crosses. Amen.

Our Father..., Hail Mary... (ten times), Glory be to the Father... May the grace of the Mystery of the Carrying of the Cross come down into our souls. Amen.

5. The Crucifixion -

The grace of Conversion of Sinners, the Relief of the Souls in Purgatory

Meditation:

Consider at what cost Our Lady has brought forth your soul to the life of grace. "All the pains inflicted upon the bodies of the martyrs" says St. Anselm, "are slight or rather they are nothing, compared to the excessive sufferings by Mary".

Honor the Queen of martyrs who has suffered so much for you. Sympathize with her in her deep sorrow and say to her with the Prophet: "To what shall I compare thy sorrow, O Virgin, Daughter of Sion, for it is great as the sea!"

After the example of Jesus and Mary, suffer willingly for the salvation of souls.

We offer Thee, O Lord Jesus, this tenth decade in honor of Thy Crucifixion and ignominious death on Calvary; we ask of Thee, through this Mystery and through the intercession of Thy holy Mother, the conversion of sinners, the perseverance of the just and the relief of the souls in purgatory. Amen.

Our Father..., Hail Mary... (ten times), Glory be to the Father... May the grace of the Mystery of the Crucifixion come down into our souls.

The Five Glorious Mysteries

1. The Resurrection - The grace of the Love of God

Meditation:

What heavenly splendor surrounds Jesus on the day of His Resurrection! How Mary's heart is filled with an overflowing abundance of love and joy when she sees her Son liberated from the bonds of death! Rejoice with her.

Consider the great kindness of your risen Saviour appearing to His disciples and to the holy women. With the same love He follows you and wishes to give Himself to you, but your soul is so different!

Lay down your requests at the feet of Mary. This kind Mother is so exceedingly happy at the Resurrection of her Son that she can refuse you nothing.

We offer Thee, O Lord Jesus, this eleventh decade in honor of Thy glorious Resurrection, and we ask of Thee, through this Mystery and through the intercession of Thy holy Mother, love of God and fervor in Thy service. Amen.

Our Father..., Hail Mary... (ten times), Glory be to the Father... May the grace of the Mystery of the Resurrection come down into our souls.

2. The Ascension - The grace of an Ardent Desire of Heaven, our true home.

Meditation:

With Mary contemplate Jesus ascending gloriously into heaven while he is surrounded by angels and by the souls He has delivered from Limbo. What a glorious triumph! What an honor and joy for Heaven!

Rejoice with Our Lady on the glory of her Divine Son. Obtain access to her heart and ask her to make you share her interior feelings after the Ascension. "Mary's longing to be with God in Heaven was so intense" says St. John Eudes, "that only by a continuous miracle could she keep alive".

But what are your desires? You wish for Jesus. But is it an earnest wish? You hope for Heaven? But what are you doing to go to Heaven? Would that like Mary you had no thoughts but for Jesus, the Eternal Wisdom! Would that you had no longing but to possess Him and His heavenly riches! Oh, how more generously would you serve Him and how zealously would you remove every hindrance to His union with you! Ask Mary to obtain that grace for you.

We offer Thee, O Lord Jesus, this twelfth decade in honor of Thy triumphant Ascension, and we ask of Thee, through the Mystery and through the intercession of Thy holy Mother, an ardent desire for Heaven, our true home.

Our Father..., Hail Mary... (ten times), Glory be to the Father... May the grace of the Mystery of the Ascension come down into our souls.

3. The Descent of the Holy Ghost -

4.

The grace of the coming of the Holy Ghost into our souls.

Meditation:

Meditate on this mystery attentively. Pay honor to your heavenly Mother, surrounded by the disciples in the Cenacle, where she receives the Holy Ghost. With what plenitude of grace is she enriched on this day! Rejoice with her and beg of her for yourself and for all her slaves of love, the grace of a closer union with her Immaculate Heart. Recall to mind these words of St. Louis De Montfort: "When the Holy Ghost has found Mary in a soul, He flies there; He enters there with the fullness of His gifts, especially the gift of wisdom, to work wonders of grace".

We offer Thee, O Lord Jesus, this thirteenth decade in honor of the Mystery of Pentecost, and we ask of Thee, through this Mystery and through the

intercession of Thy holy Mother, the coming of the Holy Ghost into our souls. Amen.

Our Father..., Hail Mary... (ten times), Glory be to the Father... May the grace of the Mystery of Pentecost come down into our souls.

4. The Assumption - The grace of a great Love of Our Lady

Meditation:

In spirit let us contemplate the last moments of our Blessed Mother. What a peaceful death is hers! Having received the visit of Jesus, her Son, in Holy Communion, and being filled with an overflowing abundance of blessedness, she dies of love as she has lived. Ask her to obtain this grace for yourself and for all who are dear to you.

Some of the Apostles are present at the last moments of Our Lady. Their hearts are disconsolate at the loss they are going to suffer. Mary with soothing words consoles them in their grief, she blesses them and leaves them assurance of her powerful mediation with Jesus Christ. Remember that she does the same for you, and that to gain your full confidence she says to you with loving tenderness: "Fear not my child, I am your Mother. I go to Heaven to prepare a dwelling place for you"

My God, how consoling these words are! Mary, my Mother! How good a Mother! And how merciful! A Mother who knows all my trials and miseries, who desires to give me relief and take me to Heaven with her.

We offer Thee, O Lord Jesus, this fourteenth decade in honor of the resurrection and triumphant Assumption of Thy holy Mother into Heaven and we ask of Thee, through this Mystery and through her intercession, a tender devotion for so good a Mother. Amen.

Our Father..., Hail Mary... (ten times), Glory be to the Father... May the grace of the Mystery of the Assumption come down into our souls.

5. The Coronation of the Blessed Virgin - The grace of Final Perseverance

Meditation:

Let us follow Our Lady as she is taken up to heaven, leaning on her well-Beloved Son, surrounded by a multitude of saints and angels. What a glorious retinue! What jubilation when this exalted Queen makes her entrance into heaven! With what joy and glory is Mary overwhelmed when, seated upon a throne of magnificence, the most Holy Trinity crowns her as the well-beloved Daughter of the Father, as the admirable Mother of the Son, as the faithful Spouse of the Holy Ghost! If even the least of the saints is filled with a heavenly bliss, what then must be the happiness of the Mother of Jesus! But what can we say of her happiness, we who are still exiled from our heavenly country? In silent admiration let us rejoice with our Mother, as well as all the blessed in heaven, whose glory and blessings are increased on this day. We offer Thee, O Lord Jesus, this fifteenth decade in honor of the Coronation of Thy holy Mother, and we ask of Thee, through this Mystery and through her intercession, perseverance in grace and a crown of glory hereafter. Amen.

Our Father..., Hail Mary... (ten times), Glory be to the Father... May the grace of the Mystery of the Coronation of the Blessed Virgin come down into our souls.

Let us pray

Hail Mary, beloved Daughter of the Eternal Father, admirable Mother of the Son, faithful Spouse of the Holy Ghost, august Temple of the most Holy Trinity! Hail, sovereign princess, to whom all owe subjection in Heaven and on earth! Hail, sure refuge of sinners, Our Lady of mercy, who hast never refused any request. All sinful though I am, I cast myself at thy feet and beseech thee to obtain from Jesus, thy beloved Son, contrition and pardon for all my sins, as well as the gift of divine wisdom. I consecrate myself entirely to thee with all that I have. I choose thee today for my Mother and mistress. Treat me, then, as the least of thy children and the most obedient of thy servants. Listen, my princess, listen to the sighs of a heart that desires to love and serve thee faithfully. Let it never be said that of all those who have had recourse to thee, I was the first to be abandoned. O my hope, O my life, O my faithful and Immaculate Virgin Mary, defend me, nourish me, hear me, teach me and save me. Amen.

Conclusion:

O holy City of God! O Virgin most high! How many perfections are there in thee to delight the blessed above! What splendor! What beauty! What admirable power! What wisdom! What light! Above all, what love for thy children here below! O merciful Mother, give me some understanding of what thou art, and captivate my heart with thy charms, that I may loathe life and desire only to be with thee. Alas, dear Mother what will become of me if thou wilt not have pity on me, exiled as I am, exposed to numberless dangers, carried away by a thousand evil inclinations laid open to every attack of the enemy? Unhappy child that I am., who shall deliver me from this body of death? As the deer pants after the fountains of water, so my soul's pants after thee, O Virgin most holy! How my soul desires to see thee! When shall I come and appear before thy face in the eternal light of God?

To the Queen of the Holy Rosary

O Queen of the most Holy Rosary, in these times of brazen impiety, show again thy power, with the signs which accompanied thy victories of old, and from the throne where thou art seated, dispensing pardon and grace, in pity watch over the Church of thy Son, His Vicar, and every order of the clergy and laity, suffering in grievous warfare. Hasten, O most powerful destroyer of heresy, hasten the hour of mercy, seeing that the hour of judgment is daily challenged by innumerable offences. Obtain for me, the lowest of men, kneeling suppliant in thy presence, the grace which may enable me to live a just life on earth, and reign with the just in heaven, whilst with the faithful throughout the world, O Queen of the most Holy Rosary, I salute thee and cry out: Queen of the most Holy Rosary, pray for us!

- 3. They have cast me forth and now they have surrounded me: they have set their eyes bowing down to the earth. (Ps. 16:11)
- 4. He shall give his cheeks to him that striketh him: he shall be filled with reproaches. (Lam. 3:30)
- 5. But I am a worm and no man: the reproach of men and the outcast of the people. (Ps. 21:7)
- 6. All they that saw me have laughed me to scorn: they have spoken with the lips and wagged the head. (Ps. 21:8)
- 7. Have mercy on me, O Lord: see my humiliation which I suffer from my enemies. (Ps. 9:14)
- 8. Christ also suffered for us ... Who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth. (1 St. Peter 2: 21-22)

The Sorrowful Mysteries

The First Sorrowful Mystery The Agony of Our Lord in the Garden of Olives

The Fourth Sorrowful Mystery The Carrying of the Cross

Curses, outrages, ill-treatments, anguish of heart, sufferings of all kinds, nothing can, O dear Redeemer, alter the mildness and patience with which Thou carriest Thy heavy cross; with like sweetness and patience dost Thou bear in the long course of ages doubts, want of confidence, murmurs, discouragement on the part of Thy children.

O Jesus, we adore Thee carrying with love the crosses prepared for Thee by Thy Father, and we beg of Thee, through the intercession of Thy holy Mother, patience in the trails of this life.

The Fifth Sorrowful Mystery The Crucifixion and Death of Our Lord Jesus Christ

It is thy privilege to dispose of all the gifts of God, just as thou willest. Such is, O heavenly Mary, the best part, which the Lord hast given thee, and which shall never be taken away from thee and this thought fills my heart with joy. As for my part here below, I wish for no other than that which was thine, to believe sincerely without spiritual pleasures, to suffer joyfully without human consolation, to die continually to myself without respite, and to work zealously and unselfishly for thee until death, and the humblest of thy servants. The only grace I beg thee, for me, is that every moment of the day, and every moment of my life, I may say " Amen, so be it, to all that thou art doing in heaven, Amen, so be it, to all thou didst do while on earth. Amen, so be it, to all thou art doing in my soul," so that thou alone may fully glorify Jesus in me for time and eternity. Amen.

Mindful alas! that we ourselves have had a share in such great indignities, which we now deplore from the depths of our hearts, we humbly ask Thy pardon and declare our readiness to atone by voluntary expiation not only for our own personal offenses, but also for the sins of those, who, straying far from the path of salvation, refuse in their obstinate infidelity to follow Thee, their Shepherd and Leader, or, renouncing the vows of their baptism, have cast off the sweet yoke of Thy Law.

We are now resolved to expiate each and every deplorable outrage committed against Thee; we are determined to make amends for the manifold offenses against Christian modesty in unbecoming dress and behavior, for all the foul seductions laid to ensnare the feet of the innocent, for the frequent violations of Sundays and holidays, and the shocking blasphemies uttered against Thee and Thy Saints. We wish also to make amends for the insults to which (Thy Vicar on earth and) Thy priests are subjected, for the profanation, by conscious neglect or terrible acts of sacrilege, of the very Sacrament of Thy Divine Love; and lastly for the public crimes of nations who resist the rights and teaching authority of the Church which Thou hast founded.

Would, O divine Jesus, we were able to wash away such abominations with our blood. We now offer, in reparation for these violations of Thy divine honor, the satisfaction Thou didst once make to Thy eternal Father on the cross and which Thou dost continue to renews daily on our altars; we offer it in union with the acts of atonement of Thy Virgin Mother and all the Saints and of the pious faithful on earth; and we sincerely promise to make recompense, as far as we can with the help of Thy grace, for all neglect of Thy great love and for the sins we and others have committed in the past. Henceforth we will live a life of unwavering faith, of purity of conduct, of perfect observance of the precepts of the gospel and especially that of charity. We promise to the best of our power to prevent others from offending Thee and to bring as many as possible to follow Thee.

O loving Jesus, through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, our model in reparation, deign to receive the voluntary offering we make of this act of expiation; and by the crowning gift of perseverance keep us faithful unto death in our duty and the allegiance we owe to Thee, so that we may one day come to that happy home, where Thou with the Father and the Holy Ghost livest and reignest God, world without end. Amen.

I intercede with Thee for the souls in purgatory, especially for those who were most devoted to the Blessed Sacrament, and to Thy most holy Mother. I recommend to Thee also, all poor sinners. And lastly, my dear Savior, I unite all my desires with the desires of Thy most loving Heart. Thus united, I present them to Thy Eternal Father, and beg Him in Thy Name and for love of Thee, to hear and answer them. Amen.

Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make our hearts like unto Thine.

Act of Spiritual Communion

I cannot now receive Thee in Holy Communion, but I beg Thee to come to me at least spiritually. I embrace Thee as already there, and unite myself entirely to Thee Grant that I may never be separated from Thee! *I adore Thee every moment, O Living Bread from heaven, Great Sacrament!*

Prayer for Increase of Daily Holy Communions

O Sweetest Jesus, Who camest into this world to give to all the life of Thy grace, and Who, to preserve and sustain it, didst will to be the remedy of our daily infirmities, and our daily food; humbly we pray Thee, by Thy Heart, all on fire for love of us, to pour out Thy Holy Spirit upon all, so that those who are

unhappily in mortal sin may be converted to Thee, and recover the life of grace which they have lost; and those who by Thy gift still live this divine life, may every day, when they are able, approach devoutly to Thy holy table, where, in daily Holy Communion, receiving every day the antidote to their daily venial sins, and nourishing the life of grace in their hearts, and purifying more and more their souls. I offer Thee my profound adoration, my sorrow, and my love, to appease and to rejoice, as much as I can, Thy Sacred Heart, in this sacrament of love and to make reparation for all the acts of irreverence and profanation, which have been committed against Thee. I love Thee with my whole soul; I acknowledge Thee as my only Master; I offer Thee all that I have, and all that I am. Jesus! I give Thee my heart with all its affections; I give Thee my soul with all its powers; I give Thee my body with all its senses. Jesus! I consecrate myself entirely to Thee; I wish to live and labor and suffer and die for the love of Thee. I abandon myself to Thee. Give me but Thy love and Thy grace; I will ask for nothing more. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done! I desire to adore and love Thee now, not only to supply the defects of those Catholics who do not adore and love Thee, but also for the conversion of heretics, schismatics, atheists, blasphemers. Jews, and idolaters. O silent dweller in the tabernacle. Thou art, indeed, a hidden God! here Thou art still the victim of the cross! A Quarter of an Hour Before the Blessed Sacrament

Speak to Me now as you would to your dearest friend. Tell Me all that now fills your mind and heart. Are there any you wish to commend to Me? Speak to Me of the poor you wish to comfort; tell Me of the sick that you would wish to see relieved. Ask of Me something for those who have been unkind to you, or who have crossed you. Ask much for them all; commend them with all your heart to Me.

And ask Me many graces for yourself. Are there not many you would wish to name that would make you happier for yourself, more useful and pleasing

to others, more worthy of My love, the dearest Lord, Master and Spouse of your soul? Tell Me the whole list of the favours you want of Me. Tell them to Me with humility, knowing how poor you are without them, how unable to gain them by yourself; ask for them with much love, that they may make you more pleasing to Me.

With all a child's simplicity, tell Me how self-seeking you are, how proud, vain, irritable, how cowardly in sacrifice, how lazy in work, uncertain in your good resolutions, and then ask Me to bless and crown your efforts. Poor child, fear not, blush not at the sight of so many failings; there are Saints in Heaven who had the faults you have; they came to Me lovingly, they prayed earnestly to Me, and My grace has made them good and holy in My sight.

You should be mine, body and soul; fear not, therefore, to ask of Me gifts of body and mind, health, judgement, memory, and success, ask for them for My sake; that God may be glorified in all things. I can grant everything, and never refuse to give what may make a soul dearer to Me and better able to fulfil the will of God.

Have you no plans for the future which occupy, perhaps distress, your mind? Tell Me your hopes, your fears. Is it about your future state? Your position among My creatures? Some good you wish to bring to other? In what shall I help and bless your goodwill?

And for Me you must have - have you not? - some zeal, some wish to do good to souls of others. Some, perhaps, who love and care for you, have ceased, almost, to know or care for Me. Shall I give you strength, wisdom and tact, to bring these poor ones close to My Heart again? Have you failed in the past? Tell Me how you acted; I will show you why you did not gain all you expected; rely on Me, I will help you, and will guide you to lead others to Me.

And what crosses have you, my dear child? Have they been many and heavy ones? Has someone caused you pain? Someone wounded your self-love: Slighted you? Injured you? Lay your head upon My Breast, and tell Me how you suffered. Have you felt that some have been ungrateful to you, and unfeeling towards you? Tell Me all, and in the warmth of My Heart you will find strength to forgive and even to forget that they have ever wished to pain you.

And what fear have you, my child? My providence shall comfort you; My love sustain you. I am never away from you, never can abandon you. Are some growing cold in the interest and love they had for you? Pray to Me for them; I will restore them to you if it be better for you and your sanctification.

Have you not some happiness to make known to Me? What has happened since you came to Me last, to console you to gladden and give you joy? What was it? A mark of true friendship you received? A success unexpected and almost unhoped for? A fear suddenly taken away from you? And did you remember the while, that in all it was My Will, My Love, that brought all that your heart has been so glad to have? It was My Hand, my dear child, that guided and prepared all for you. Look to Me now, my child, and say: "Dear Jesus, I thank you." You will soon leave Me now; what promises can you make Me? Let them be sincere ones, humble ones, full of love and desire to please Me. Tell Me how carefully you will avoid every occasion of sin, drive from you all that leads to harm, and shun the world... the great deceiver of souls.

Promise Me to be kind to the poor; loving for My sake, to friends; forgiving to your enemies, and charitable to all, not in word alone and actions, but in your very thoughts. When you have little love for your neighbor, whom you see, you are forgetting Me who am hidden from you.

Love all My Saints; seek the help of your holy patrons. I love to glorify them by giving you much through them. Love above all, my own sweet glorious Mother - She is your Mother; O love Her, speak to Her often, and She will bring you to Me, and for Her sake I will love and bless you more each day.

Return soon to Me again, but come with your heart empty of the world, for I have many more favours to give, more than you can know of; bring your heart so that I may fill it with many gifts of My love.

I will, therefore, meditate on Thy sufferings and visit the stations of Thy Passion in company with Thy sorrowful Mother and my guardian angel, with the intention of promoting Thy honor and saving my soul. I desire to gain all the indulgences granted for this holy exercise for myself and for the Poor Souls in Purgatory. O merciful Redeemer, who hast said, "And I, if I be lifted from earth, will draw all things to Myself," draw my heart and my love to Thee, that I may perform this devotion as perfectly as possible, and that I may live and die in union with Thee. Amen.

First Station Jesus is Condemned to Death

Priest: Jesus, arriving exhausted at the foot of Calvary, falls for the third time to the ground. His love for us, however, is not diminished, not extinguished. What a fearfully oppressive burden our sins must be to cause Jesus to fall so often! Had He, however, not taken them upon Himself, they would have plunged us into the abyss of Hell.

People: Most merciful Jesus, I return Thee infinite thanks for not permitting me to continue in sin and to fall, as I have so often deserved, into the depths of Hell. Enkindle in me an earnest desire of amendment; let me never again relapse, but vouchsafe me the grace to persevere in penance to the end of my life.

> O thou Mother! fount of love Touch my spirit from above. Make my heart with thine accord: **Tenth Station** Jesus is Stripped of His Garments

We adore Thee, O Christ, and we praise Thee, Because by Thy holy cross Thou hast redeemed the world.

Priest: When Our Saviour had arrived on Calvary, He was cruelly despoiled of His garments. How painful this must have been because they adhered to His wounded and torn body, and with them parts of His bloody skin were removed! All the wounds of Jesus are renewed. Jesus was despoiled of His garments that He might die possessed of nothing; how happy will I also die after laying aside my former self with all evil desires and sinful inclinations!

People: Induce me, O Jesus, to lay aside my former self and to be renewed according to Thy will and desire. I will not spare myself, however painful this should be for me: despoiled of things temporal, of my own will, I desire to die, in order to live for Thee forever.

> Make me feel as thou hast felt; Make my soul to glow and melt With the love of Christ, my Lord.

Eleventh Station Jesus is Nailed to the Cross

We adore Thee, O Christ, and we praise Thee, Because by Thy holy cross Thou hast redeemed the world.

Priest: Jesus, being stripped of His garments, was violently thrown upon the cross and His hands and feet nailed thereto. In such excruciating pains He remained silent, because it pleased His heavenly Father. He suffered patiently, because He suffered for me. How do I act in sufferings and in troubles? How fretful and impatient, how full of complaints I am!

People: O Jesus, gracious Lamb of God, I renounce forever my impatience. Crucify, O Lord, my flesh and its concupiscences; scourge, scathe, and punish me in this world, do but spare me in the next. I commit my destiny to Thee, resigning myself to Thy holy will: may it be done in all things!

Our Father. Hail Mary. Glory Be.

Lord Jesus, crucified, *Have mercy on us!*

> Holy Mother, pierce me through! In my heart each wound renew Of my Saviour crucified. **Twelfth Station** Jesus is Raised upon the Cross and Dies

We adore Thee, O Christ, and we praise Thee, Because by Thy holy cross Thou hast redeemed the world.

Priest: Behold Jesus crucified! Behold His wounds, received for love of you! His whole appearance betokens love: His head is bent to kiss you; His arms are extended to embrace you; His Heart is open to receive you. O superabundance of love, Jesus, the Son of God, dies upon the cross, that man may live and be delivered from everlasting death!

People: O most amiable Jesus! Who will grant me that I may die for Thee! I will at least endeavor to die to the world. How must I regard the world and its vanities, when I behold Thee hanging on the cross, covered with wounds? O Jesus, receive me into Thy wounded Heart: I belong entirely to Thee; for Thee alone do I desire to live and to die.

Let me share with thee His pain, Who for all our sins was slain, Who for me in torments.

Thirteenth Station

Jesus is Taken down from the Cross and Placed in the Arms of His Mother We adore Thee, O Christ, and we praise Thee,

Because by Thy holy cross Thou hast redeemed the world.

Priest: Jesus did not descend from the cross but remained on it until He died. And when taken down from it, He in death as in life, rested on the bosom of His Holy Mother. Persevere in your resolutions of reform and do not part from the cross; he who persevereth to the end shall be saved. Consider, moreover, how pure the heart should be that receives the body and blood of Christ in the Adorable Sacrament of the Altar.

People: O Lord Jesus, Thy lifeless body, mangled and lacerated, found a worthy resting place on the bosom of Thy virgin Mother. Have I not often compelled Thee to dwell in my heart, full of sin and impurity as it was? Create in me a new heart, that I may worthily receive Thy most sacred body in Holy Communion, and that Thou mayest remain in me and I in Thee for all eternity.

Lord Jesus, crucified, *Have mercy on us!*

> Let me mingle tears with thee, Mourning Him who mourned for me, All the days that I may live. Fourteenth Station Jesus is Laid in the Sepulchre

We adore Thee, O Christ, and we praise Thee, Because by Thy holy cross Thou hast redeemed the world.

Priest: The body of Jesus is interred in a stranger's sepulchre. He who in this world had not whereupon to rest His head, would not even have a grave of His own, because He was not from this world. You, who are so attached to the world, henceforth despise it, that you may not perish with it.

People: O Jesus, Thou hast set me apart from the world; what, then, shall I seek therein? Thou hast created me for Heaven, what then, have I to do with the world? Depart from me, deceitful world, with thy vanities! Henceforth I will follow the Way of the Cross traced out for me by my Redeemer, and journey onward to my heavenly home, there to dwell forever and ever.

Our Father. Hail Mary. Glory Be.

Lord Jesus, crucified, *Have mercy on us!*

> By the cross with thee to stay, There with thee to weep and pray, Is all I ask of thee to give.

Concluding Prayer

Together: Almighty and eternal God, merciful Father, who hast given to the human race Thy beloved Son as an example of humility, obedience, and patience, to precede us on the way of life, bearing the cross: Graciously grant us that we, inflamed by His infinite love, may take up the sweet yoke of His Gospel together with the mortification of the cross, following Him as His true disciples, so that we shall one day gloriously rise with Him and joyfully hear the final sentence: "Come, ye blessed of My Father, and possess the kingdom which was prepared for you from the beginning, "where Thou reignest with the Son and the Holy Ghost, and where we hope to reign with Thee, world without end. Priest: Consider how Jesus, after having been scourged and crowned with thorns, was unjustly condemned by Pilate to die on the Cross.

People: My adorable Jesus,* it was not Pilate,* no, it was my sins that condemned Thee to die.* I beseech Thee, by the merits of this sorrowful journey,* to assist my soul in its journey towards eternity.* I love Thee, my beloved Jesus;* I love Thee more than myself,* I repent with my whole heart of having offended Thee.* Never permit me to separate myself from Thee again.* Grant that I may love Thee always;* and then do with me what Thou wilt.*

Second Station. Jesus is made to carry His Cross

Priest: Consider that Jesus, in making this journey with the Cross on His shoulders thought of us, and offered for us to His Father the death He was about to undergo.

People: My most beloved Jesus,* I embrace all the tribulations Thou hast destined for me until death.* I beseech Thee,* by the merits of the pain Thou didst suffer in carrying Thy Cross,* to give me the necessary help* to carry mine with perfect patience and resignation.* I love Thee, Jesus my love;* I repent of having offended Thee.* Never permit me to separate myself from Thee again.* Grant that I may love Thee always;* and then do with me what Thou wilt.*

Third Station. Jesus falls the First Time

Priest: Consider this first fall of Jesus under His Cross. His flesh was torn by the scourges, His head crowned with thorns, and He had lost a great quantity of blood. He was so weakened that he could scarcely walk, and yet he had to carry this great load upon His shoulders. The soldiers struck Him rudely, and thus He fell several times in His journey.

People: My beloved Jesus,* it is not the weight of the Cross,* but my sins,* which has made Thee suffer so much pain.* Ah, by the merits of this first fall,* deliver me from the misfortune of falling into mortal sin.* I love Thee, O my Jesus, with my whole heart;* I repent of having offended Thee.* Never permit me to separate myself from Thee again.* Grant that I may love Thee always;* and then do with me what Thou wilt.*

Fourth Station. Jesus meets His Sorrowful Mother

Priest: Consider the meeting of the Son and the Mother, which took place on this journey. Jesus and Mary looked at each other, and their looks became as so many arrows to wound those hearts which loved each other so tenderly.

People: My most loving Jesus,* by the sorrow Thou didst experience in this meeting,* grant me the grace of a truly devoted love for Thy most holy Mother.* And thou, my Queen,* who wast overwhelmed with sorrow,* obtain for me by thy intercession* a continual and tender remembrance of the Passion of thy Son.* I love Thee,* Jesus my love;* I repent of ever having offended Thee.* Never permit me to offend Thee again.* Grant that I may love Thee always;* and then do with me what Thou wilt.*

People: My most sweet Jesus,* I will not refuse the Cross, as the Cyrenian did;* I accept it; I embrace it.* I accept in particular the death Thou hast destined for me;* with all the pains that may accompany it;* I unite it to Thy death,* I offer it to Thee.* Thou hast died for love of me;* I will die for love of Thee, and to please Thee.* Help me by Thy grace.* I love Thee, Jesus my love;* I repent of having offended Thee.* Never permit me to offend Thee again.* Grant that I may love Thee always;* and then do with me what Thou wilt.*

Sixth Station. Veronica Wipes the Face of Jesus

People: My most beloved Jesus,* Thy face was beautiful before,* but in this journey it has lost all its beauty,* and wounds and blood have disfigured it.* Alas! my soul also was once beautiful,* when it received Thy grace in Baptism;* but I have disfigured it since by my sins;* Thou alone, my Redeemer,* canst restore it to its former beauty.* Do this by Thy Passion, O Jesus.* I repent of having offended Thee.* Never permit me to offend Thee again.* Grant that I may love Thee always;* and then do with me what Thou wilt.*

Seventh Station. Jesus Falls a Second Time

People: My most gentle Jesus,* how many times Thou hast pardoned me,* and how many times have I fallen again,* and begun again to offend Thee!* Oh, by the merits of this new fall,* give me the necessary helps to persevere in Thy grace until death.* Grant that in all temptations which assail me* I may always commend myself to Thee.* I love Thee, Jesus my love, with my whole heart;* I repent of having offended Thee.* Never permit me to offend Thee again.* Grant that I may love Thee always;* and then do with me what Thou wilt.*

Eighth Station. The Women of Jerusalem weep over Jesus

Priest: Consider how those women wept with compassion at seeing Jesus in so pitiable a state, streaming with blood, as He walked along. But Jesus said to them: "Weep not for Me, but for your children."

People: My Jesus,* laden with sorrows, I weep for the offences I have committed against Thee,* because of the pains which they have deserved,* and still more because of the displeasure they have caused Thee,* who hast loved me so much.* It is Thy love, more than the fear of hell,* which causes me to weep for my sins.* My Jesus, I love Thee more than myself;* I repent of having offended Thee.* Never permit me to offend Thee again.* Grant that I may love Thee always;* and then do with me what Thou wilt.*

People: Ah, my outraged Jesus,* by the merits of the weakness Thou didst suffer in going to Calvary,* give me strength sufficient to conquer all human respect,* and all my wicked passions,* which have led me to despise Thy friendship.* I love Thee, Jesus my love, with my whole heart;* I repent of having offended Thee.* Never permit me to offend Thee again.* Grant that I may love Thee always;* and then do with me what Thou wilt.*

Tenth Station. Jesus is Stripped of His Garments

People: My Jesus! loaded with contempt,* nail my heart to Thy feet, that it may ever remain there,* to love Thee, and never quit Thee again.* I love Thee more than myself;* I repent of having offended Thee.* Never permit me to offend Thee again.* Grant that I may love Thee always;* and then do with me what Thou wilt.* *Our Father. Hail Mary. Glory Be*

Twelfth Station. Jesus is raised upon the Cross and Dies

Priest: Consider how thy Jesus, after three hours' Agony on the Cross, consumed at length with anguish, abandons Himself to the weight of His body, bows His head, and dies.

People: O my dying Jesus,* I kiss devoutly the Cross on which Thou didst die for love of me.* I have merited by my sins to die a miserable death;* but Thy death is my hope.* Ah, by the merits of Thy death,* give me grace to die, embracing Thy feet,* and burning with love for Thee.* I commit my soul into Thy hands.* I love Thee with my whole heart;* I repent of ever having offended Thee.* Never permit me to offend Thee again.* Grant that I may love Thee always;* and then do with me what Thou wilt.*

- 61. To fulfil God's commandments daily in one's deeds.
- 62. To love chastity.
- 63. To hate no one.
- 64. Not to be jealous, not to harbor envy.
- 65. Not to love contention.
- 66. To beware of haughtiness.
- 67. And to respect the seniors.
- 68. To love the juniors
- 69. To pray for one's enemies in the love of Christ.
- 70. To make peace with one's adversary before the sun sets.
- 71. And never to despair of God's mercy.

These, then are the tools of the spiritual craft. If we employ them unceasingly day and night, and return them on the Day of Judgement, our compensation from the Lord will be that wage He has promised: "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, what God has prepared for those who love Him."

Devotions for Confession

Prayer before Confession

O Almighty and most merciful God, who hast made me out of nothing, and redeemed me by the Precious Blood of Thine only Son; Who hast borne with me to this day with so much patience, notwithstanding my sins and ingratitude, behold me, O Lord, prostrate at Thy feet to implore Thy forgiveness. I desire most sincerely to leave all my evil ways, to forsake this region of death where I have so long lost myself, and to return to Thee, the Fountain of life. I desire, like the prodigal child, to enter seriously into myself, and with the like resolutions to rise without delay and go home to my Father, though I am infinitely unworthy to be called His child, in hopes of meeting with the like reception from His most tender mercy. I know Thou desirest not the death of a sinner, but that he may be converted and live. I know Thy mercies are above all Thy works; and I most confidently hope, that as in Thy mercy Thou hast spared me so long, and hast now given me this desire of returning to Thee, so Thou wilt finish the work Thou hast begun, and bring me to a perfect reconciliation with Thee. I desire now to comply with Thy holy institution of the sacrament of penance. I desire to confess my sins with all sincerity to Thee and to Thy minister, and therefore, I desire to know myself and to call myself to an account by a diligent examination of my conscience.

But, O my good God, what will it avail me to know my sins, if Thou dost not also give me a hearty sorrow and repentance for them? Without this, my sins will be all against me still and I shall be still Thine enemy and a child of hell. Thou insistest upon a change of heart, without which there can be no reconciliation with Thee; Oh! Give it me, then, dear Lord, at this time. Give me a lively faith and a firm hope in the Passion of my Redeemer. Teach me to fear Thee and to love Thee. Give me, for Thy mercy's sake, a hearty sorrow for having offended so good a God.

O Blessed Virgin, Mother of my Redeemer, mirror of innocence and sanctity, and refuge of penitent sinners, intercede for me, through the Passion of Thy Son, that I may obtain the grace to make a good confession. O, all you blessed Angels and Saints of God, pray for me, a most miserable sinner that my heart may henceforward be forever united with yours in eternal love, and never more go astray from the sovereign Good. Amen.

Examination of Conscience

Begin by examining yourself on your last confession and Communion. Whether a grievous sin was forgotten through want of proper examination; concealed or disguised through shame. Whether you confessed without a true sorrow, a firm purpose of amendment and of repairing the evil done to your neighbor.

See whether you received Holy Communion without devotion, or neglected to offer a proper thanksgiving. Whether the penance was performed without voluntary distractions. Whether you have neglected your confessor's counsel, and fallen at once into habitual sins. Whether you have renounced all affection to mortal sin, or remained long in sin without eliciting acts of contrition and returning to confession. Then examine yourself on the ten Commandments; the Commandments of the Church; the Seven Capital sins; the duties of your state in life; and your ruling passion. Calmly recollect the different occasions of sin which have fallen in your way, or to which your state and condition in life expose you; the places you have frequented; the persons you have associated with etc. Do not neglect to consider the circumstances which alter the grievousness of the sin, nor the various ways in which we become accessory to the sins of others. The following short table will help you in your examination.

The Commandments of God

1. Have you doubted in matters of faith? Murmured against God at your adversity or at the prosperity of others? Despaired of His mercy? Believed in fortune tellers or consulted them? Gone to places of worship belonging to other denominations? Not recommended yourself daily to God?

- 2. Taken the Name of God in vain? Spoken irreverently of holy things, or profaned anything relating to religion? Sworn falsely rashly, or in slight and trivial matters? Cursed yourself, or others, or any creature? Angered others so far as to make them swear, or blaspheme God?
- 3. Have you kept holy the Lord's Day, and all other days commanded to be kept holy? Bought or sold things, not of necessity, on that day? Done or commanded some servile work not of necessity? Missed Mass or been wilfully distracted during Mass? Talked, gazed, or laughed in church?
- 4. Have you honoured your parents, superiors, masters, according to your just duty? Deceived them, disobeyed them? Failed in due reverence to aged persons?
- 5. Procured, desired, or hastened the death of anyone? Borne hatred; oppressed anyone; desired revenge; not forgiven; refused to speak to others; used provoking language; threatened or struck others not under your charge; made others fall out?

6 and 9 Have you been guilty of lascivious dressing or painting; lewd company; have you read immodest books; been guilty of unchaste songs, discourses, words, looks, or actions with yourself or others? Wilfully entertained impure thoughts or desires?

7. Stealing; deceit in gaming, reckoning, buying or selling, in wares, prices, weights or measures; bought of such as could not sell; wilfully damaged another man's goods, or negligently spoiled them; run into debt carelessly, beyond your power of payment?

8. Borne false witness, called injurious names; revealed another's sins; flattered yourself or others; opened the letters of others; judged rashly; falsely suspected?
10. Coveted unjustly anything that belonged to another?

The Precepts of the Church

Have you observed the Sundays and holy days by hearing Mass and avoiding servile works? Have you neglected prescribed fasts and abstinence's without sufficient reason? Have you confessed your mortal sins at least once a year? Have you gone to Holy Communion during the Easter time? Have you contributed according to your means to religion and the Church? Have you married not in accordance with the laws of the Catholic Church, or aided others in doing so?

The Seven Capital Sins

Pride, Covetousness, Lust, Anger, Gluttony, Envy, Sloth.

Have you been guilty of pride, vainglory, love of applause, contempt of others? Have you been too eager in seeking the goods of this world, or had your heart set on them? Have you violated the Sixth and Ninth Commandments in any way? Have you been guilty of unreasonable anger, or disagreeableness of disposition? Have you eaten or drunk to excess, or caused others to do so? Have you rejoiced at the misfortune, or been grieved at the success of others? Have you wasted time in idleness and self indulgence? Have you neglected the duties of your state of life, or performed them remissly? Have you desired to commit sin, or gloried in sin committed?

The Four Sins which Cry to Heaven for Vengeance

- 1. Wilful Murder. 2. The sin of Sodom. 3. Oppression of the poor.
- 4. Defrauding the laborer of his wages.

Sins Against the Holy Ghost

- 1. Presumption of God's mercy. 2. Despair 3. Impugning the known truth.
- 4. Envy at another's spiritual good. 5. Obstinacy in sin. 6. Final impenitence.

Nine ways of being accessory to another's sin

1. By counsel. 2. By command. 3. By consent. 4. By provocation. 5. By praise or flattery. 6. By concealment 7. By partaking. 8. By silence. 9. By defense of the ill done.

The Seven Spiritual Works of Mercy

- 1. To admonish sinners. 2. To instruct the ignorant. 3. To counsel the doubtful.
- 4. To comfort the sorrowful. 5. To bear wrongs patiently. 6. To forgive all injuries. 7. To pray for the living and the dead.

The Seven Corporal Works of Mercy

1. To feed the hungry. 2. To give drink to the thirsty. 3. To clothe the naked. 4. To visit and ransom the captives. 5. To harbor the harborless. 6. To visit the sick. 7. To bury the dead.

The Eight Beatitudes

- 1. Blessed are the poor in spirit; for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- 2. Blessed are the meek; for they shall possess the land.
- 3. Blessed are they that mourn; for they shall be comforted.
- 4. Blessed are they that hunger and thirst after justice; for they shall be filled.
- 5. Blessed are the merciful; for they shall obtain mercy.
- 6. Blessed are the clean of heart; for they shall see God.
- 7. Blessed are the peacemakers; for they shall be called the children of God.
- 8. Blessed are they that suffer persecution for justice sake; for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

After the Examination

Having discovered the different sorts of sins of which you have been guilty, together with their number, enormity, or such circumstances as may considerably increase their malice, or change their nature, you should endeavour to excite in your breast a heartfelt sorrow for having committed them, and a sincere detestation of them. This being the most essential, as well as the most difficult, of all the dispositions, requisite for a good confession, with what humility, fervour, and perseverance should you not importune Him who holds the hearts of men in His hands to grant it to you.

Affections and Resolutions before Confession

My Lord and my All! I am confounded at the multitude and enormity of my offences against so good a God. I dare not presume even to lift up my eyes to heaven, much less to come near Thine altar, after so many treason's against Thee. Alas! What shall I now do, O Lord? what shall I say? With the humble publican, I will strike my breast, and cry unto Thee, O God, be merciful to me, a sinner.

My sins exceed in number the sands of the sea. But Thy mercies are still greater in number than my sins. O ocean of mercy! Have compassion on me, a poor sinner, and make me, now at least, a true penitent.

Father, I have sinned against heaven and in Thy sight, and am not worthy to be called Thy child. O receive me as one of the least of Thy servants, and never suffer me to stray from Thee again.

It grieves me, O my God, that I have offended Thee. I am heartily sorry for all the sins I have committed against Thine infinite goodness. Oh, that I could sufficiently lament them, even with tears of blood!

Who will give water to my head, and a fountain of tears to my eyes, that, night and day, I may bewail all my sins and my ingratitude?

Oh, that I had never offended my God! Oh, that I had never sinned! Happy those souls who have never lost their baptismal innocence! Ah! Sweet Jesus, that I had been so happy!

Oh, that I could now, like Magdalen, prostrate myself at the feet of my Saviour! Oh, that I could wash them with my tears. Oh, suffer me, dear Lord, to lay down all my sins at Thy feet, to be cancelled by Thy precious Blood.

Lord, Thou hast said there is joy in heaven upon one sinner's doing penance more than upon ninety nine just. Oh, give me now grace to be a true penitent indeed, that hereby heaven may rejoice at my conversion.

Thou camest, O my dear Redeemer, not to call the just, but sinners to repentance. Look down upon me, a poor miserable sinner, and draw me now powerfully to Thee by Thy grace.

I know Thou willest not the death of a sinner, but that he be converted and live. Oh, let me no longer remain dead in my sins! Oh, let me now at least begin to live to Thee!

Create a clean heart in me, O God, and renew a right spirit within my bowels. Oh, grant that I may now serve Thee in good earnest! Let this be the change of the right hand of the Most High.

Thou hast made me, O my God, and redeemed me by Thy precious Blood. Oh, despise not the work of Thy hands, and let not Thy Blood be spilt for me in vain!

Too late have I known Thee, O eternal truth! Too late have I gone astray from Thee! From this moment, O my Sovereign Good, I desire to be forever Thine! Oh, let nothing in life or death ever separate Thee from me anymore!

O Divine Lover of penitent souls, give me henceforth a contrite and humble heart. I wish from this hour to offer this sacrifice to Thee daily to the end of my life. O Divine Love, how little art Thou known in this wicked world! How little art Thou loved! Come now, and take full possession of my whole heart and soul for time and eternity.

Thy mercy has been infinite in bearing so long with so ungrateful a sinner as I have been, and in daily heaping Thy favors upon me. Add this one favor, O Lord, to all the rest, that henceforth, through Thy grace, I may never offend Thee more. This one thing I earnestly beg of Thee, for Thine infinite mercy's sake and through the death and Passion of Thine only Son. Hear this one prayer, I beseech Thee, and in all things else do with me what Thou pleasest.

I am resolved, by Thy grace, never more to turn to my sins. Oh, rather let me die than offend Thee willfully any more. I am resolved to avoid all evil company and dangerous occasions, and to take proper measures for a thorough amendment of my life for the future. All this I resolve; but Thou knowest my frailty, O my God: and if Thou assist me not with Thy grace, all my resolutions will prove ineffectual, and I shall be forever miserable. Oh, look to me, O Lord, that I may never betray Thee any more

Act of Contrition

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended Thee, and I detest all my sins, because I dread the loss of heaven and the pains of hell, but most of all because they offend Thee, my God, who art all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of Thy grace, to confess my sins, to do penance, and to amend my life.

Prayer after Confession

O Almighty and most merciful God, who, according to the multitude of Thy tender mercies, hast vouchsafed once more to receive Thy prodigal child after so many times going astray from Thee, and to admit me to this Sacrament of reconciliation: I give Thee thanks with all the powers of my soul for his and all other mercies, graces, and blessings bestowed on me, and prostrating myself at Thy sacred feet, I offer myself to be henceforth forever Thine. Oh, let nothing in life or death ever separate me from Thee! I renounce with my whole soul all my treasons against Thee, and all the abominations and sins of my past life. I renew my promises made in baptism, and from this moment I dedicate myself eternally to Thy love and service. Oh, grant that for the time to come, I may abhor sin more than death itself, and avoid all such occasions and companies as have unhappily brought me to it. This I resolve to do by the aid of Thy divine grace, without which I can do nothing. I beg Thy blessing upon these my resolutions, that they may not be ineffectual like so many others I have formerly made, for, O Lord, without Thee I am nothing but misery and sin. Supply also, by Thy mercy, whatever defects have been in this my confession, and give me grace to be now and always a true penitent. Through the same Jesus Christ Thy Son. Amen.

God to glorify, Jesus to imitate, The Angels and Saints to invoke, A soul to save, A body to mortify, Sins to expiate, Virtues to acquire, Hell to avoid, Heaven to gain, Eternity to prepare for, Time to profit by, Neighbours to edify, The world to despise, Devils to combat, Passions to subdue, Death perhaps to suffer, Judgment to undergo.

A Husband's Prayer

O gracious Father, Maker and Preserver of heaven and earth. Who in the beginning didst institute matrimony, thereby foreshadowing the mystical union of the Church with our Savior Christ, who, during His ministry upon earth, did honor marriage with His first miracle: help me, I pray Thee, by Thy grace to live in holiness and purity with the wife whom Thou hast given me. Mortify in me all violence of earthly passion, all selfishness and inconsiderateness (here name any besetting sin which may be a hindrance to you), that I may love her as Christ loved His Church, cherish and comfort her as my own body, and have as great care for her happiness as for my own. Grant that we may live in peace, without contention; in unity, without discord, (Give us, O Lord, discreet hearts and understanding minds, to bring up our children in Thy faith and fear, that they may be obedient to Thee and to Thy commandments, and to all that Thou requirest of them in their duties towards their parents.) And give us, O Lord, a sufficiency of those things necessary to maintain ourselves and our family according to that rank and calling

Grant that our perfect union here may be the beginning of the still more perfect and blissful union hereafter in Thy kingdom; and this I pray through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Prayer Before Any Work

Come, Holy Ghost, fill the hearts of Thy faithful and kindle in them the fire of Thy love. Send forth Thy spirit, and they shall be created. And Thou shalt renew the face of the earth. O God, who hast taught the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant that by the gift of the same Spirit we may be always truely wise and ever rejoice in His consolation. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Prayer After Any Work

We fly to thy patronage, O holy Mother of God: despise not our petitions in our necessities, but deliver us from all dangers, O ever glorious and blessed Virgin! May the divine assistance remain always with us! Amen

Prayer for Protection during the Night

O Angel of God, to whose holy care I am committed by the divine mercy, enlighten, defend and protect me this night from all sin and danger. Amen. Visit, we beseech Thee, O Lord, this habitation, and drive from it all the snares of the enemy. Let Thy holy Angels dwell herein to preserve us in peace; and may Thy blessing be upon us for ever, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

God the Father, bless us; Jesus Christ, defend and keep us; the virtue of the Holy Ghost enlighten and santify us this night and forever; and may the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen.

Bless, O Lord, the repose I am going to take in order to renew my strength, that I may be better able to serve Thee. O all ye Saints and Angels! But chiefly thou, O Mother of God! intercede for me this night and during the rest of my life, but particularly at the hour of my death.

May the divine assistance remain always with us. Amen.

Prayer to Saint Michael the Archangel

Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle; be our defense against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, thrust into hell Satan and the other evil spirits who prowl about the world for the ruin of souls. Amen.

Preparation for Holy Mass

Declaration of Intention

Eternal Father, I unite myself with the intentions and affections of our Lady of Sorrows on Calvary, and I offer to Thee the sacrifice that Thy beloved Son Jesus made of Himself upon the cross, and now renews upon this altar:

First: To adore Thee and give Thee the honor that is due to Thee, confessing Thy supreme dominion over all things, and the absolute dependence of everything upon Thee, Thou Who art our one and last end.

Second: To thank Thee for the countless benefits received.

Third: To appease Thy justice, provoked by so many sins, and to make satisfaction for them.

Fourth: To implore grace for myself, for (name), for all afflicted and sorrowing, for poor sinners, and for the holy souls in purgatory. Amen.

Prayer for Vocations

O Lord Jesus Christ, who didst take to Thyself a body and soul like ours, to teach us the glory of self-sacrifice and service, mercifully deign to instill in other hearts the desire to dedicate their lives to Thee. Give us PRIESTS to stand before Thine altar and to preach the words of Thy Gospel; BROTHERS to assist the priests and to reproduce in themselves Thy humility; SISTERS to teach the young and nurse the sick, and to minister Thy charity to all; LAY PEOPLE to imitate Thee in their homes and families. Amen.
